

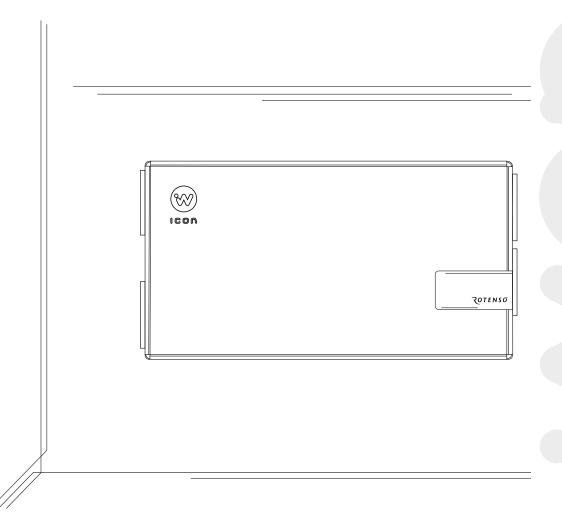

### 1. Basic Information

### 1.1 General information

This user manual is aimed at users of the Rotenso Wentilo ICON IS series heat recovery units. Please read the heat recovery unit user manual before using the unit. The latest version of the user manual is available at **rotenso.com**.

### 1.2 Precautions

The safety precautions in the user manual must be strictly adhered to, as ignoring these instructions may result in death or serious injury. The precautions listed in the document are divided into the following categories. Read the instructions carefully before turning on the appliance. Keep the manual in an easily accessible place for later reference.

### Meaning of the symbols DANGER, WARNING, CAUTION and NOTE.

### **⚠** DANGER

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

Incorrect installation of equipment or accessories can cause electric shock, fire, flooding or damage to the equipment. Use only accessories designed for use with the equipment. Have it assembled by a qualified person.

# **MARNING**

It is forbidden to modify or repair the unit yourself - only qualified installers are allowed to do this.

### **A** CAUTION

In order to use a Rotenso brand heat recovery unit safely, the installation should be carried out by a qualified installer.

### **⚠** CAUTION

It is forbidden to cover or reduce the cross-section of spigots connections.

### 1.3 Conditions of use

The heat recovery unit must be installed in a room where the air temperature is maintained between +5°C and +45°C.

The relative humidity of the air in the room where the heat recovery unit is installed should be maintained at a level that ensures no condensation on the surface of the housing and on the surfaces of the unit's components. Unit must not be exposed to precipitation or direct sunlight. The air supplied to the heat recovery unit should not contain hazardous substances, i.e. chemical fumes, flammable, explosive mixtures, coarse dust.

### **₽** NOTE

Regular filter replacements are essential for proper heat recovery unit operation. Excessive dirtiness of the filters reduces the efficiency of the heat recovery unit and increases the noise level.

### 1.4 Operating principle

The heat recovery unit provides a continuous exchange of used air from the building for fresh air drawn from outside with simultaneous heat recovery from the extract air and filtration of the supply air. The unit recovers heat from the extract air with an efficiency of up to 90%, reducing the heating costs of the building and increasing the comfort of the occupants by supplying air at a temperature close to room temperature. Variable speed energy-efficient fans ensure low electricity consumption.

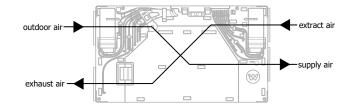
Units equipped with an airENTHALPY heat exchanger additionally recover moisture from the exhaust air, increasing the humidity of the supply air.

# Supply air quality is ensured by 4 air treatment stages:

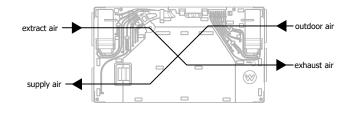
- (1) **STAGE 1:** anti-pollen filter iCARE G4 Coarse 75% removes 75% of particles larger than 10 µm
- (2) **STAGE 2:** anti-smog filter iCARE F7 ePM1 70% removes 70% of particles smaller than 1 μm removes 80% of particles smaller than 2.5 μm removes 93% of particles smaller than 10 μm
- (3) **STAGE 3:** The **airCare+** antibacterial coating reduces bacterial growth in the appliance
- (4) **STAGE 4:**  $\mathsf{airION}$   $\mathsf{air}$  ioniser

The condensate generated by the heat transfer of the exhaust air is discharged into a condensate drain.

# Principle diagram of the counterflow exchanger for Alternative (B) version.



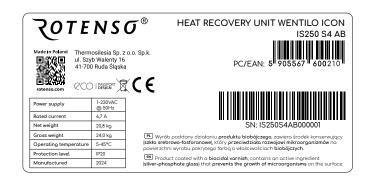
### 1.5 Scope of responsibility

### 1.6 Technical data of the device

The basic specifications of the heat recovery unit are included on the nameplate, which is located on the heat recovery unit housing, to the right of the control system compartment and on the shipping carton. When contacting the manufacturer's service, indicate the serial number of the appliance, indicated by the SN symbol on the nameplate.

Additional technical data can be found in the product fiche and the data sheet.

### 2. Switching the heat recovery unit on and off

### **⚠** DANGER

Before connecting the unit to the mains, ensure that the ventilation ducts are firmly fixed to the heat recovery unit.

### Switching on

- 1 Insert the mains plug into the socket
- 2 On the technical cover, **switch** the power button from **O** to **I**

### Off

- On the technical cover, **switch** the power button from position **I** to **O**
- 2 Pull the mains plug out of the socket

### Stand-by mode

The device can be put into stand-by mode from the control panel, the mobile app or the website by clicking/off icon. Turn on of the device from stand-by mode is performed similarly.

### 3. Control panel operation

For proper operation, the unit should be equipped with an iSWITCH Ti or iSENSE 5i control panel, which must be purchased separately. Once properly configured, both panels allow the unit to be controlled using the iCONNECT mobile app and the iCONNECT WEB service.

The iCONNECT app is available for download from Google Play and the App Store.

The iCONNECT WEB service is available at **wentilo.com**. A full user manual for the iCONNECT application and iCONNECT WEB service is available at **rotenso.com**.

## **⚠** CAUTION

Control panel should be installed by a qualified installer.

### **♀** NOTE

Control panel is designed for wall mounting, in dry rooms only.
The panel must not be used in condensation conditions and must be protected from water.

### $\bigcirc$ NOTE

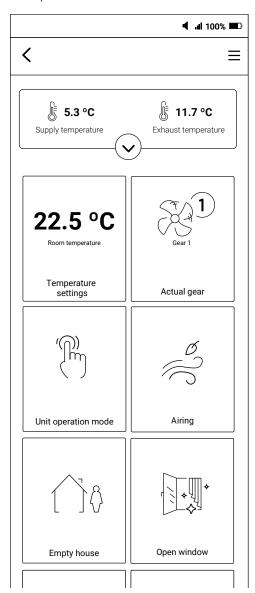
In order to reduce interference with the panel's temperature measurements, avoid locations with strong sunlight, poor air circulation, close to heating equipment, directly next to doors and windows (typically min. 200 mm from the edge of the door).

### 3.1 Remote control of the heat recovery unit

### **ICONNECT**



The user can control the heat recovery unit using the iCONNECT application installed on the mobile device, i.e. an Android or iOS phone or tablet. The app allows full real-time monitoring and control of the unit, selection of momentary modes or reading parameter graphs from the unit's history. The above functions can be accessed by creating a user account, adding the panel to the user account and adding the installation component.



### **ICONNECT WEB**

Once the unit is fully configured, the user can also control the heat recovery unit via the iCONNECT WEB service available at the **wentilo.com** website. The internet service enables full real-time monitoring and control of the device, selection of momentary modes or reading of parameter graphs from the device history. Access to the above functions is possible after creating a user account, adding a panel to the user account and adding an installation component.

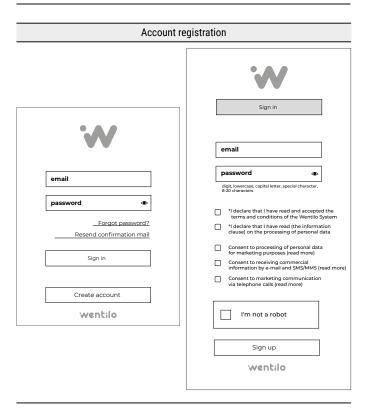
# 3.2 Create user account in the iCONNECT mobile application

The iCONNECT mobile application allows the installation to be added to a user account and allows the heat recovery unit connected to a WiFi network to be controlled. For these processes it is necessary to set up a user account, as described in the instructions below.

### Downloading the iCONNECT mobile application



The iCONNECT app is available for download from Google Play and the App Store. Download, install and launch the mobile app.



- After starting the application, the login window will appear.
   For the first login, *click* the tile: Create account, which will open a new window.
- In the account registration window, you will need to enter your email address and password and additionally accept all necessary statements and optionally marketing consents.
- The checkbox I am not a robot must then be ticked and then click the Sign up tile.
- ► An activation link will be sent to the email address provided. Once registration is confirmed, the account becomes active.

The iSWITCH Ti control panel is a panel equipped with a sensor array. The control panel allows direct control of basic functions such as changing the gear of the fans, changing the operation mode and switching to stand-by mode. Built-in WiFi and BT modules also allow the heat recovery unit to be controlled via the iCONNECT mobile application or via the iCONNECT WEB service. An integrated temperature and humidity sensor allows the heat recovery unit operation to be matched to the room conditions.

### 3.3.1 Operation of the iSWITCH Ti panel

Basic operation of the control panel occurs by touching the selected iSWITCH Ti control panel function button.

### **Button symbols and LED indications mean:**

With the iSWITCH Ti control panel it is not possible to verify all the operating parameters of the system, but only the basic functions of the heat recovery unit.

# 3.3.2 Adding the iSWITCH Ti panel to the user account

Adding the iSWITCH Ti panel to the user account can be done using the iCONNECT mobile application. Before configuring the iSWITCH Ti panel, follow the steps described in section 3.2 Create user account in the iCONNECT mobile application.

In the event of problems, alternatively you can use the Wentilo **Installation Assistant** available in the iCONNECT PRO app, which is available for download on Google Play and the App Store. The iCONNECT PRO application allows you to search

for Rotenso devices available nearby. Searching for and connecting to devices is only performed in the Standard for wireless BT communication.

### Configuration using the iCONNECT application

### Preparation of the iSWITCH Ti panel

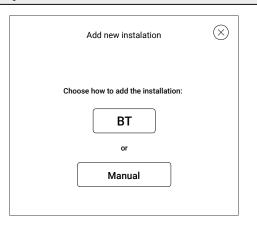
The iSWITCH Ti control panel must be switched to BT mode. BT communication is active if the LED next to the  $\widehat{\Xi}$  icon flashes several times per second.

If the LED is lit continuously or flashes approximately 1 time per second, **touch** and **hold** the switch on the control panel marked with the symbol: Until all the light elements on the panel start to flicker.

### 2 Login

Open the iCONNECT app, then enter the email address and password you provided when registering your account and click Login.

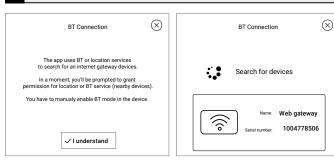
### 3 Creating an installation account



- After logging in, the Choose installation window appears.
   Click the Add tile. This will open the Add new installation window
- The User has two options to choose from: BT and Manual. Select BT mode, which automatically detects iSWITCH Ti control panels in the vicinity working in BT (they act as an internet gateway).

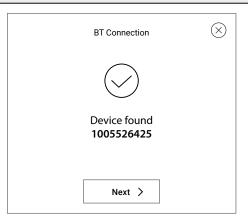
**Notes:** in case of problems with the connection in this mode, follow the connection instructions using the **Wentilo Installation Assistant**, whose instructions can be found below.

### 4 Connecting to the panel



- User must allow the application to access the location in order to search for nearby devices.
- When the iSWITCH Ti panel (a nearby device) is found, the application informs the user with an appropriate message. Click the web gateway tile, confirming that the appropriate device has been selected.

### 5 Acceptance of terms and conditions



- Once the device has been selected, a new screen will appear to confirm that communication has been established.
- ► Click Next. This will open the Marketing agreements window. You will need to grant access to your personal data and accept all necessary statements and optionally marketing consents.

### 6 Choice of installation name

You need to define the Name of the installation, which will be visible in the iCONNECT mobile app and the iCONNECT WEB service. The name can be anything you like. After entering the name, confirm it by clicking the Add button.

**Caution:** If you see the notification *Installation is already added to account*, please contact your supplier.

### 7 WiFi configuration

- ► The user should see the WiFi Configuration pop-up. Select Yes to start configuring the WiFi module of the iSWITCH Ti panel.
- ► **Enter** the **SSID** of the WiFi network and the **password** with which the network is encrypted. Then **click Confirm**. A message should appear informing you that the WiFi configuration has been correctly completed.
- ► The iSWITCH Ti panel will switch to WiFi Mode. Once the panel is successfully connected to the WiFi network, you can proceed to the process of adding an installation component as described in section 3.3.3 Adding an installation component.

**NOTE:** WiFi connection is indicated by a steady light next to the icon  $\widehat{\Xi}$ 

**Hint:** if the connection is not successful, follow the section on **changing WiFi settings**.

### 8 Changing WiFi settings

- ▶ If you enter an incorrect network SSID or password, switch the panel to BT mode (see section Preparation of the iSWITCH Ti panel).
- ► Next, in the iCONNECT application, select the installation by *clicking* the **Select** button and then *click* **WiFi settings**.
- ► Allow the application to access the location so that it can search for devices in the vicinity.
- ► Once the iSWITCH Ti panel is found, the application informs you with an appropriate message.
- ➤ **Click** the internet gateway tile, confirming the selection of the appropriate device.
- After a successful connection, the WiFi Configuration window opens where you can overwrite your network settings. Once the changes have been made, click Confirm. The iSWITCH Ti panel will automatically switch to the WiFi mode.

# Configuration using Wentilo Installation Assistant

### Preparation of the iSWITCH Ti panel

- ► The iSWITCH Ti control panel must be switched to BT mode.
- ▶ BT communication is active if the LED next to the ♠ icon flashes several times per second.

  If the LED is lit continuously or flashes approximately 1 time per second, **touch** and **hold** the switch on the control panel marked with the symbol: until all the light elements on the panel start to flicker.
- ► BT communication mode can be active before the application is launched, or it can be activated while the application is in use the user may be prompted to do so.

### Preparing the phone for connection to iSWITCH Ti



### **iCONNECT PRO**

- ► The iCONNECT PRO app must be downloaded and installed on the phone from Google Play (for Android phones) or the App Store (for iOS phones).
- Searching for BT devices via the app requires your phone to have active BT and location settings.
- Turn on these features in your phone's settings, then open iCONNECT PRO app and click the Begin tile.

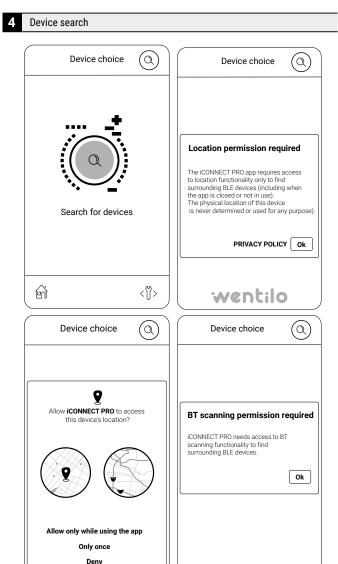


### 3 Consent to use of required functionality





- The first time the app is launched, the user will be asked for consents to use the required functionalities. In the Android version of the app, the number of messages varies depending on the version of the system used.
- The consents are one-time only. Once they have been approved, the user will not be asked again for consents to access the phone's functionality.



- Open the next screen: Device choice.
- Click the magnifying glass icon in the middle of the screen to search for available devices - iSWITCH Ti panels. Again, the first time the application is launched, the user, depending on the phone's operating system, may be asked to agree to the use of the of the required functionalities.
- ► Once all required consents and settings have been approved, the app will begin the process of searching for devices in the vicinity.

### iCONNECT PRO Searching for devices - troubleshooting

The application automatically detects the available devices - Rotenso control panels, acting as the internet gateway for the entire device. If there is no other active device of the same type and operating in BT mode on the site within a close proximity of a few metres, only one internet gateway item with an SN number should appear on the screen. The last 7 digits of the **SN** number match the serial number of the panel. The **serial number** of the panel can be read on the factory sticker located on the inside of the panel, visible after removing the wall mounting element to which the control cables are connected.

### If the application does not detect the control panel by itself:

- click the magnifying glass button at the top of the screen when the list of available devices is not visible,
- **perform** a swipe gesture (swiping from top to bottom across the list) to refresh it when the list of available devices is visible.

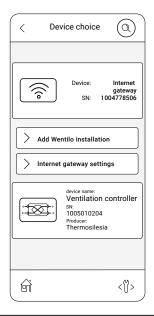

### **iCONNECT PRO**

- ► If an item with the corresponding **SN** number appears, it is selected by *clicking* a tile on the screen.
- When you click the tile with the internet gateway icon with the corresponding SN number, the application will connect to the control system main board - labelled "ventilation controller".
- Once connected to the control panel, the Selected device screen will appear. Then click the tile: Add Wentilo installation, which will launch the installation assistant.

**Note:** The iCONNECT PRO application has a built-in Installation Assistant to help guide the user through the process of adding an installation in the Wentilo service (e.g. iCONNECT application).

### **ICONNECT PRO**

- Confirm that you wish to start further configuration by clicking the Get started tile.
- ➤ The Installation Assistant consists of 7 steps. Steps 1 - 4 refer to creating an account in the iCONNECT application or in the iCONNECT WEB service (wentilo.com) and logging in with your own account (account registration for users logging in for the first time) and selecting the add installation function.
- Navigating between the steps is possible using the buttons at the bottom of the screen or by using right/left swipe gestures.

**Note:** In order to complete the process of adding an installation, it is necessary to enter the so-called iCONNECT PRO password (or token), which is a unique and independent sequence of six digits for each device.

Wentilo Installation Assistant - step 1 Download the iCONNECT application and register an account

### **iCONNECT**

▶ Download the application and register an account according to the instructions in section 3.2 Create user account in the iCONNECT mobile application.

### **ICONNECT PRO**

 After registering your account, you can proceed to the next step by clicking Next.

### **ICONNECT**

When the application opens, enter the email address and password you provided when registering your account and click the Login button.

### ▶ iCONNECT PRO

After logging in to your account, you can go to the next step by *clicking* the **Next** button.

9 Wentilo Installation Assistant - step 3 Create installation account

### **ICONNECT**

- After logging in, the **Installation selection** window is displayed.
- Click the Add tile.
- ► This will open the **Add new installation** window.

The User has two options to choose from: **BT** and **Manual**. **Manual mode** should be selected.

10 Wentilo Installation Assistant - step 4 Adding a panel manually

### **ICONNECT**

You need to define the Installation name that will be visible in the iCONNECT mobile app and the iCONNECT WEB service. The name can be anything you wish.

### **iCONNECT PRO**

Once the account name has been entered, you can proceed to the next step by *clicking* Next. The serial number of the control panel will be displayed, which you need to *enter* in the Serial number field in the iCONNECT application.

**Hint:** Serial number can be copied by clicking on it.

### **iCONNECT**

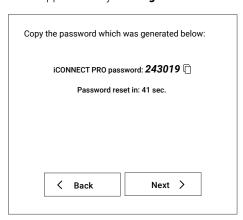
After filling the Serial number field, you can proceed to to the next step by clicking Next. This will open the Marketing consents window. You must grant access to your personal data and accept all necessary statements and optionally marketing consents.
User will be asked to enter a password from the mobile

User will be asked to enter a **password from the mobile application** (token), which is generated in the next step.

### **ICONNECT PRO**

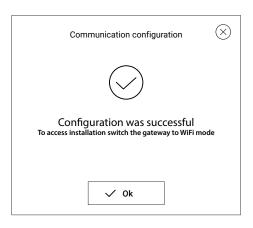
 Proceed to step 5 by clicking Next. The iCONNECT PRO Password will be displayed which must be copied into the iCONNECT application by clicking it.



**Note:** the password is generated automatically in real time every approx. 1 minute, without any user input. **iCONNECT** 

► Enter or paste the password from the mobile application and click the Confirm tile.

 Once the correct **token** has been entered, confirmation of correct registration will be displayed..
 By accepting the **OK** tile, the first installation element will appear.



**Caution:** If you see the notification *Installation is already assigned to account*, please contact your supplier.

### **iCONNECT PRO**

- Proceed to step 6 by clicking Next. The Device network settings window will be displayed. In this window, define the SSID and WiFi network password.
- ► The **SSID** of the network can be found by clicking the icon and **selecting** the appropriate network from the list.
- ► A password suitable for the selected network can be entered by clicking the icon
- After entering the SSID and password, you can proceed to the next step by clicking Next.

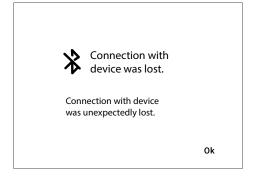
### 13 Wentilo Installation Assistant - step 7 Switching the panel to WiFi mode



### **iCONNECT PRO**

- After step 6, a window should appear to switch the panel to WiFi mode.
- Switch the iSWITCH Ti panel from the currently used BT mode to WiFi mode to connect to the network.
- In order to switch to WiFi mode after completing the adding of installation process, activate the WiFi mode switch located in the middle of the screen.
- You can end the process of adding the installation by clicking the Finish button. A screen will appear informing you of the end of the adding of installation process, followed by a note that the connection to the device has been lost.
- The LED on the panel next to the symbol will switch to a continuous light signal.

**Note:** switching to WiFi mode will cause the iCONNECT PRO application to lose connection with the control panel. You can turn on BT mode again by holding down the button on the iSWITCH Ti panel for 5 seconds.



### 3.3.3 Adding an installation component

Once the iSWITCH Ti panel has been correctly configured as described in section 3.3.2 Adding the iSWITCH Ti panel to the user account, the installation component (Wentilo heat recovery unit) can be added to the user account. This process is described below for the iCONNECT mobile application.

### **ICONNECT**

### Adding an installation component

 Open the iCONNECT mobile app and then select the correct installation from the list of installations by clicking Open.

**Note:** the status on the app screen should be ONLINE. If the installation is **OFFLINE**, verify the panel's network connection.

**Hint:** the installation list can be refreshed by swiping on the screen from the top down.

This will open the page adding a component to the installation, i.e. the Wentilo heat recovery unit.
To do this, click the New installation component tile, then select the ventilation controller and confirm the selection with the Accept button.

# An installation consisting of two components will be created:

- an internet gateway (iSWITCH Ti panel)
- ventilation controller (main control board of the Wentilo heat recovery unit)

### 2 Completion of the contact information

 Once the installation components have been added to the User account, contact details can be completed to help identify the installation.

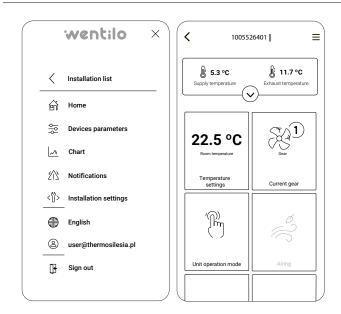
**Hint: Instalation name** will be displayed on the top bar of the user application home screen, helping to identify the system.

### 3 Returning to menu

Once you have completed your contact details, you can return to the home screen by *expanding* the Menu list in the top right corner =.
 In the menu, click **Home**, which will open the main screen of

In the menu, click **Home**, which will open the main screen of the user application.

Hint: Clicking the icon in the middle of the upper part of the screen will open the list of the main parameters of the heat recovery unit, i.e. temperatures, ventilation intensity, the degree of filter contamination etc. The amount of information displayed depends on installed and active components working with the heat recovery unit within the whole ventilation system.



When the heat recovery unit is switched on, the start screen is initially displayed, where the button:

Configure

Takes you to the device configuration screen. Access protected by installer password.

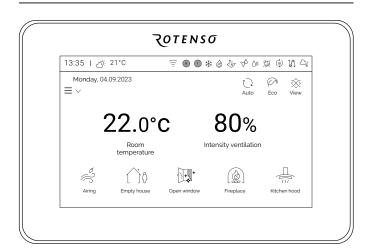
Get started

Takes you to the home screen.

### 3.4 iSENSE 5i control panel



The iSENSE 5i control panel is equipped with a colour touchscreen. The Panel allows direct changes to all parameters of the unit. Built-in WiFi and BT modules also enable the heat recovery unit to be controlled via the iCONNECT mobile app or via the iCONNECT WEB service.

The integrated temperature sensor allows the heat recovery unit to match the conditions of the room in which the iSENSE 5i panel is installed.

### 3.4.1 Switching the heat recovery unit on



If start window remains idle for 30 s, panel will automatically switch to the home screen.

The start window can only be reopened after a power reset of the heat recovery unit.

# 3.4.2 Adding the iSENSE 5i panel to the user account

Adding the iSENSE 5i panel to a user account can be done using the iCONNECT mobile application. Before configuring the iSENSE 5i panel, follow the steps described in section 3.2 Create user account in the iCONNECT mobile application.

If you experience problems with the configuration in **BT mode**, you can use the **configuration in manual mode**.

### Configuration in BT mode

### Completion of the contact information

Once the installation components have been added to the User account, contact details can be completed to help identify the installation.

Hint: Instalation name will be displayed on the top bar of the user application home screen, helping to identify the system.

### Returning to menu

Once you have completed your contact details, you can return to the home screen by **expanding** the Menu list in the top right corner =

In the menu, click **Home**, which will open the main screen of the user application.

**Hint:** *Clicking* the icon — in the middle of the upper part of the screen will open the list of the main parameters of the heat recovery unit, i.e. temperatures, ventilation intensity, the degree of filter contamination etc. The amount of information displayed depends on installed and active components working with the heat recovery unit within the whole ventilation system.

### Operation modes tiles



There are interactive buttons below the status bar.

The first position from the left switches the operation mode of the heat recovery units.

### The available modes are:



**Auto**, in this mode the heat recovery unit monitors the air quality using dedicated sensors and adjusts the fans control based on the readings.



Manual, in this mode the flow rate of the fans can be freely set.



Schedule

**Schedule**, in this mode the Fans operate according to a preprogrammed schedule, depending on the gears configured. Any heat recovery unit flow rate can be assigned for a given gear.

Position two allows you to switch between the operating modes of the complementary devices.

### The available modes are:



**Comfort**, in this mode the heat recovery unit uses additional components to regulate the supply air temperature to the comfort temperature (complementary devices: secondary heater, cooler, condnsing unit).



Eco

**Eco**, in this mode the heat recovery unit does not use additional components to regulate the supply air temperature to the comfort temperature in order to save electricity.

Position three allows the status of the heat recovery unit to be monitored:



**View** takes you to the heat recovery unit diagram presentation screen, where you can monitor the current status of the individual components.

### Main values tiles

The centre of the display shows two main pieces of information about the operation of the heat recovery unit: **room temperature** and **ventilation intensity**.

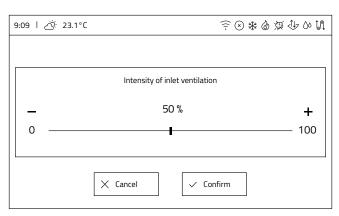

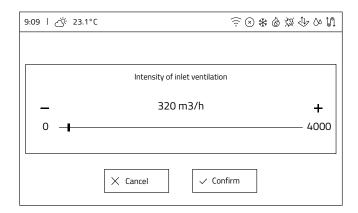
The **room temperature** tile displays the current measured room temperature. The area is only clickable if additional supply air temperature controls are configured. After clicking the area, the user will be taken to a window with the option of setting the comfort temperature as day (for a description of the temperature for day, see the section on temperature schedules).

The **ventilation intensity** tile displays the current fans control. Clicking this area takes the user to the window for setting ventilation intensity. The format of the presented unit (% or m3/h) depends on the type of heat recovery unit airflow control.



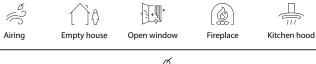
Heat recovery unit with iEDGE control system - ventilation intensity will be presented in %

### Momentary operation modes tiles

At the bottom of the screen are icons for quick activation of **momentary operation modes.** Pressing the icon activates a time mode (only one time mode can be active at a time). Momentary operation modes available are:





**Airing**, the heat recovery unit operates with increased fan power for a set duration to quickly ventilate the rooms.



**Empty house**, switches off the heat recovery unit for the time the user leaves the room/building. It is possible to set the date and time for the mode to be switched on in advance, as well as for the airing function to be switched on/off.



**Open window**, mode to assist the flow of outside air through the window. Supply fan control is set to a preset value expressed as a percentage and the extract fan control is stopped.



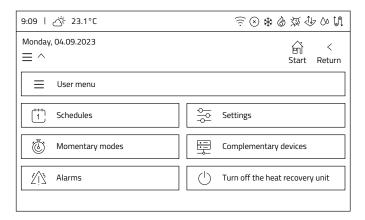
**Fireplace**, turning on the fireplace function increases the power difference between the supply fan and the exhaust fan by they intensity value set by the user, for the set duration. This creates a positive pressure in the house to improve the chimney draught.



**Kitchen hood**, mode allows the air extracted by the kitchen hood to be balanced, whereby the supply fan power is increased and the Extract fan flow rate is reduced to a user-set value.

### 3.4.5 Menu

When the menu icon  $\equiv \checkmark$  is clicked on the home screen, the user is taken to the user menu window.



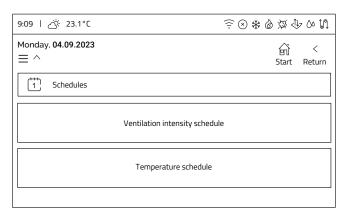

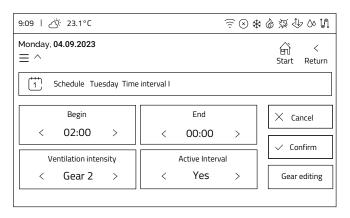

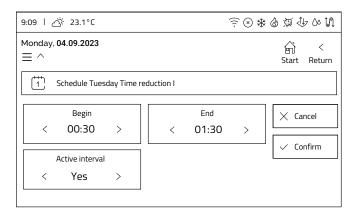

### 3.4.9 Complementary devices

The **Complementary devices** screen, which is opened from the User menu, presents all available devices that support the maintenance of the comfort temperature but are not an integral part of the heat recovery unit, including:

- ground heat exchanger (GHE),
- · secondary heater,
- · cooler,
- condensing unit (interchangeably as an integration of secondary heater and cooler).

The menu allows the user to quickly enable/disable these devices. The display of available devices must be preceded by their initial configuration by the manufacturer/installer.

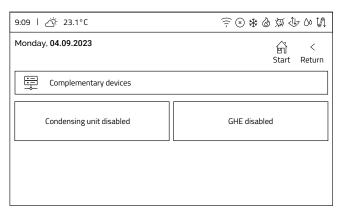

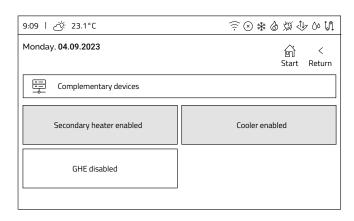

Each alarm has an associated description to help diagnose the fault.

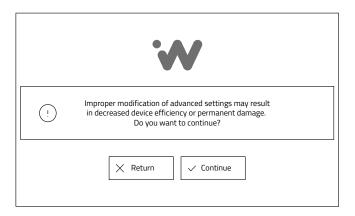

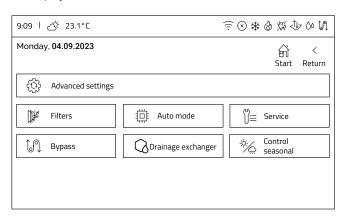


### 3.4.11 Advanced

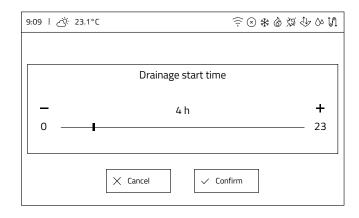
Exchanger drainage is an operation mode in which the supply fan and then the extract fan are controlled for a specific period of time. The exchanger is cleaned of accumulated condensed water vapour coming from the air flowing through it. The algorithm is set from the installer menu.

User can set the time at which the drainage procedure will start.

## 4. Maintenance

## 4.1 Air filters replacement

## **♀** NOTE

Regardless of the version of the heat recovery unit assembly, filter replacement operations are carried out in the same way as described below.

## **₽** NOTE

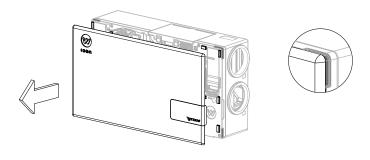
Always use original filters. The use of substitutes may adversely affect the quality of air filtration and the electric consumption of the appliance.

The unit indicates each time the filters need to be replaced by illuminating the filter replacement light on the control panel. Environmental conditions, i.e. the degree of air pollution, the presence of dust or smog in the environment where the ventilation system is located, can have a significant impact on the frequency of filter replacement.

## Get started with the filter replacement procedure

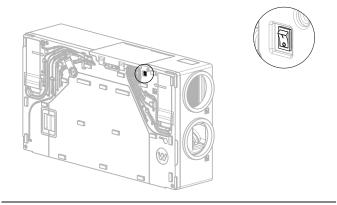
Before starting to replace the filters, the **Filter replacement** procedure must be activated on the **iSENSE 5i** panel (described in *section 3.4.11 Advanced*), on the iCONNECT mobile app or on the iCONNECT WEB service.

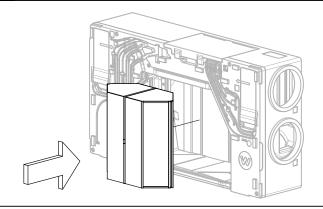


- Grab the strap on the heat exchanger and slowly pull it out from the heat recovery unit, holding the unit with the other hand while being careful of the side gaskets in the housing.
- Check and, if necessary, correct the position of the bottom gasket in the housing.

## Wash the exchanger according to the following steps:

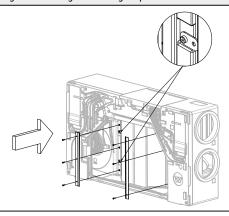
- **Insert** the exchanger into the tank (i.e. bathtub).
- **2 Rinse** the exchanger with clean water.
- Pour the soap solution into the bottom of the container. Using a small container, pour the solution into all the channels of the heat exchanger.
- 4 Clean the outer walls of the exchanger with a soft brush.
- **5** Fine **rinse** the soap solution from the exchanger.
- **Remove** standing water from the heat exchanger by rotating the heat exchanger several times.
- **7 Dry** the exchanger with a dry cloth.
- **Leave** the exchanger to dry one day in a well-ventilated, dry room.

### 6 Inserting the heat exchanger into the housing



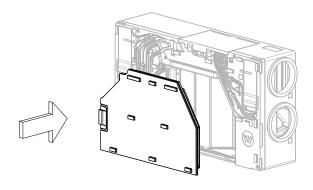
- Insert the washed heat exchanger in the appropriate place, taking care of the side gaskets in the housing.
- Secure the heat exchanger against sliding out by turning 4 mounting plates.

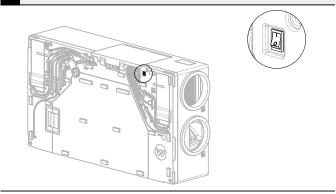

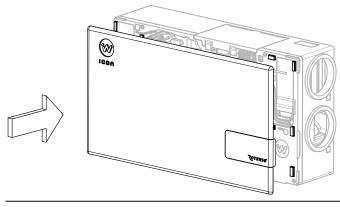
